Warsaw Troubled by Student Group

WARSAW, Nov. 4.—The case of Karol Modzelewski and his friends and their ideas continues to plague the Government of Poland.

Mr. Modzelewski, who is a young instructor at Warsaw University, and one colleague are already in prison, and yesterday the university board of discipline was reported to have decided to expel four members of Mr. Modzelewski's student following. Several others were reported to have been warned.

At the time of the reports, there were signs on the campus demanding that Mr. Modzelewski be freed and be returned to the university. Students reported an unusual number of plainclothes policemen on the campus.

The Modzelewski case is particularly ironic. The young instructor is the son of the late Zygmunt Modzelewski, the Polish Foreign Minister from 1947 to 1951. Karol Modzelewski is or at least was until his most recent difficulties, a dedicated Communist, which is unusual among young university people in Warsaw.

Made Visit to Italy

In 1963 he went to Italy for a year and became interested in the Italian Communist party's idea of debate within the party. He decided to try to transplant some of those ideas and ended up in jail.

His case has dragged on and in its determination to stop this type of dissent. In the process the case has very slowly become something of a cause here, even with people who had no use at all for Mr. Modzelewski before he was sent to prison.

When Mr. Modzelewski came back from Italy he and some friends put together papers challenging some of the party's economic and political ideas.


These views were circulated and the party, annoyed, disciplined Mr. Modzelewski and his colleagues, taking away their memberships. Some were threatened with suspension from the university. It was known that Mr. Modzelewski's mother, headed with high officials, had her son not be re-

moved from his post as an assistant at the university. had a difficult time finding out when the appeal would be heard.

The group however continued to discuss its ideas, this time outside the framework of the party. In the spring members of the group were arrested. Mr. Modzelewski was given three and a half years, and a colleague, Jacek Kuron, three years on charges of having disseminated papers false and prejudicial to the state.

The case was appealed, but the appeal was delayed and delayed, and interested persons had a difficult time finding out when the appeal would be heard. About two weeks ago an appeal was heard and denied. Students and some professors had gathered in a campus courtyard and sang the International. Some students also tried to collect funds for Mr. Modzelewski and for the Modzelewski and Kuron families. Flowers were placed on the grave of Mr. Modzelewski's father. There has been almost no mention of the case in the press.

Poles Expel Reporter for N.Y. Times

From News Dispatches

WARSAW, Dec. 27 — The Polish government today ordered the expulsion of David Halberstam, 31, the correspondent of The New York Times. An official announcement accused him of publishing "a series of slanderous articles" about Poland.

Halberstam thus became the second New York Times Pulitzer Prize-winning reporter to be expelled from Poland. In 1959, A. M. Rosenthal, now the Metropolitan Editor of the Times, was ordered to leave for "delving too deeply" into Polish affairs.

Six months ago Halberstam married a star of the Polish stage, screen and television, 26-year-old Elzbieta Czyzewska. It was not known immediately whether she would be able to accompany Halberstam when he leaves the country in about a week or whether contractual commitments would force her to follow later.

Halberstam was summoned to the Foreign Ministry and told his accreditation had been withdrawn because he had "displayed an attitude of continuous hostility" since he arrived here last January.

Halberstam said he believed the story which impelled the Foreign Ministry to act was one published a week ago which concerned the lack of popular support for the Communist regime here. The report said the government, installed by the occupying Red Army in 1945, was bound to Moscow more closely than ever by this lack of support.

Earlier this year, Halberstam was severely criticized in the Polish press for a story which said that historical Polish anti-semitism was still an active force in life here. He was called to the Foreign Ministry on numerous occasions to hear official objections to his reporting.

[In Washington, State Department spokesman Robert J. McCloskey said the United States deplors "any effort to impose censorship by restriction or expulsion."]

A U.S. Embassy spokesman in Warsaw said the action "is not in the interests of better United States-Polish relations that we seek."

Halberstam shared the 1964 Pulitzer Prize for reporting from Vietnam. Earlier, he covered the Congo for the Times and worked in the Southern United States.



The article by David Halberstam which appeared in the February 6, 1966, magazine section of the "New York Times" (previously mentioned) was entitled "Poland Has Seen the Future." Pertinent excerpts concerning Mieczyslaw Moczar are set out below.

"Rising Star

"Perhaps the most vibrant and most controversial figure in Poland today is Mieczyslaw Moczar, the Minister of the Interior. Moczar is at once a secret policeman, the head of the most dynamic wing of the party and a clever politician.

"Under normal conditions perhaps no one would be feared more as a possible successor to Gomulka than a man with a background in the secret police. But given the grayness and the drift of present-day Poland there is a quality in Moczar which many Poles find attractive.

"The revisionists, as well as many foreign diplomats, look on his group as highly nationalistic and a little anti-Semitic (primarily within the framework of the party, his people edging the older, usually Jewish, members out of positions). But to many other Poles, Moczar is a considerably different figure. He is an enormously handsome, vigorous man with a fine speaking voice. He is not associated with any policy as such

(like housing or transport), and so is not tarred by the difficulties of present-day life. Rather, despite his connection with the Ministry of the Interior, he has contented himself with a public image that is intensely Polish, and which is in considerable contrast to that of most other top officials, who are rarely seen in public.

"There is the Television Actors' Ball, and there is Moczar, dancing with confetti in his hair (while placing more and more of his people in the television officialdom). There is the premiere of a major Polish film, and there is Moczar attending it, and afterward standing very conspicuously on the steps of the theater under the lights talking to friends and being seen. There is Moczar writing his own book about his wartime experiences as a partisan and then having a film made of it; Moczar going around to veterans' groups and preaching unity and nationalism, particularly to members of the non-Communist Home Army, who were persecuted by the Communists after the war.

Polish

"There is Moczar making very direct contacts with writers and intellectuals, and Moczar going to see the new play "Tango," by Slawomir Mrozek, in which there is an unpleasant character who might be construed as Moczar, and having the good sense and good politics to applaud at the end. This entire quality--of being Polish, of doing Polish things--has immense appeal among an intensely nationalistic people, particularly a frustrated nationalistic people.

"In addition, on straight party grounds, Moczar runs an unusually vital group. While many of the other factions are led by or composed of older party members, Moczar has encouraged youth, and has made sure there is a place for everyone in his expanding group.

"For some older Poles, there is no forgiveness, no trust. To them, Moczar was a policeman before, and handsome or not, he is the Minister of Interior now. But others, many of whom frankly admit that they do not know what his politics are--indeed, if they differ at all from Gomulka's--sense in him a vitality, a feeling that somehow he will bring some change and some direction. That they do not know what change or direction is unimportant.

"So far, the relations between Gomulka and Moczar have been guardedly correct. There is a subtle behind-the-scenes game in which Gomulka has tried first to block and then to accommodate Moczar's rise to power. Yet, if there is any political competition in Poland today, it is between Gomulka and Moczar. Similarly, despite all the things Moczar has going for him, he has one disadvantage: the ability to stir strong feelings among opponents which might lead to a possible coalition of oppositions..."



Polish Press Scores Actress-Wife of U.S. Writer

WARSAW, April 14 — Elzbieta Czyzewska, the Polish actress and the wife of David Halberstam, a former correspondent of The New York Times here, has been denounced in the press and on television for her husband's allegedly "anti-Polish" reporting.

The attack came in a published letter to Andrzej Wajda, film director who was criticized for having hired Miss Czyzewska to play a major role in "Everything for Sale," a movie he is making here.

Miss Czyzewska, who returned to Poland from her home in New York in January to make the film, finished her work and flew to the West yesterday.

The letter was first printed in Walka Mlodych, a Communist youth organization weekly. It was reprinted last week by some Polish newspapers and read on the state-controlled television. It also appeared in a newspaper with today's date.

'Unforgettable Roles' Cited

Signed by Wlodimierz Stepinski, the letter noted that Miss Czyzewska "was for many years Poland's best-known actress, having created unforgettable roles."

"I say 'was' because two years ago she married David Halberstam, the American journalist, and left the country."

The letter said that in 1966 Mr. Halberstam, then the correspondent of The New York Times in Poland, had been expelled "for writing and publishing stories slandering Poland."

When Mr. Halberstam left the New York Times last year

to work for Harper's Magazine, he "slandered Poland even more and, especially, lied about our cultural life," the letter said.

It added that an article by Mr. Halberstam in Harper's last summer entitled "Life, Love and Selling Out in Poland," had been a "dirty libel against our country." The letter charged that Mr. Halberstam had "mixed up his facts and had added information that he had invented to paint Polish life in the blackest colors."

The letter said that the "spite and hostility" in the article had a deep effect on Polish public opinion. It said this was harm-

ful because the article had been addressed to American intellectuals who would draw their knowledge of Poland from it.

The letter said Miss Czyzewska was an excellent actress but that the article had discredited her in the eyes of her admirers.

The letter expressed the hope that Mr. Wajda's film would be another artistic success. But some observers doubted the sincerity of another sentence that expressed the hope that millions of Mr. Wajda's admirers would see it.

The Polish film world has been under attack in the current political crisis. Mr. Wajda's

film would not be the first production to be banned or shelved.


Mr. Halberstam Comments

"It would be very difficult to libel the Polish Government," Mr. Halberstam said in Washington yesterday. "The Government's own activities in recent months speak for themselves."

Mr. Halberstam described his Harper's article as "a very personal account of the complexities of being a Western reporter in Poland," as well as a description of the sterile political life in the country in the nineteen-sixties, "especially in the area of culture."




